GREEN BAY ROAD MAINTENANCE RESURFACING IMPROVEMENT – STATUS UPDATE

Paving work will begin with the first lift of asphalt between Westley Road and Lake Cook Road beginning the week of July 13. This first layer of asphalt is expected to take between 3-4 days for the entire length of the project. Following that step, manhole structures will be adjusted back up to grade followed by the final layer of asphalt, likely during the week of July 20 with pavement markings to follow. All of these steps will impact traffic flow, and may result in short lane closures or other traffic stoppages.

While Green Bay Road will remain open to traffic during construction, the Village encourages motorists to use alternate routes when possible (Sheridan Road or Vernon Avenue to Dundee Road) to avoid delays. Bicyclists are also encouraged to monitor conditions and use alternate routes. ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS – JULY 6

The Zoning Board of Appeals met on July 6 and approved two items. The first was a fence height variation request for 10 Maple Hill, for higher driveway entry columns and gates. The second were zoning variation requests for 1046 Edgebrook, for three additions to the existing house. The additions required variations reducing the north and south side yard setbacks.

The next Zoning Board of Appeals meeting will take place on Monday, August 3.

VILLAGE COMMENCES SALE OF \$5.0 MILLION IN GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, FIRST OF TWO ISSUANCES

On Wednesday, July 8, the Village held a successful \$5.0 million bond sale, receiving seven bids with the low bidder being Raymond James & Associates, Inc., of St. Petersburg, Florida. The results of the bid were a True Interest Cost (TIC) of 3.142%, within the expectations of the Village and our financial advisors. The sale was conducted within the parameters

authorized by the Village Board in an ordinance approved this spring, following a voter approved set of Referendum questions. This is the first of two bond issues that will total \$10 million to be used for stormwater improvements, roadway resurfacing, sanitary sewer maintenance and the replacement of the HVAC system in the Glencoe Village Hall.

WHERE'S THE FARMERS MARKET?

Some residents have been wondering why the Glencoe Farmers Market is taking a hiatus this year. For many years the Chamber of Commerce has coordinated a market in the downtown business district as an opportunity for residents to purchase fresh produce, flowers, and other items directly from area farmers. The market has operated on Saturday mornings from June to October in various locations, most recently on Village Court between Village Hall and Grand Foods. Historically, an outside market manager has been contracted with to oversee operations and to recruit and sustain weekly vendors.

This year there will not be a Farmers Market in Glencoe. The Chamber of Commerce Board, in consult with Village staff, recognizes that the current model for the Farmers Market needs a "TuneUp" due to low turnout of both vendors and residents. It is for these reasons that a Chamber of Commerce subcommittee has been formed to study the situation in order to improve the market for next year.

It is recognized that the Farmers Market is an asset to the Village not just for purchasing locally grown fruits and vegetables, but also as an opportunity for residents to come together weekly. This interaction reinforces the small town character that makes Glencoe unique. Thank you for your patience this year and we look forward to providing you with a new experience in 2016!
