ASSISTANT VILLAGE MANAGER TO BECOME MEQUON, WISCONSIN CITY ADMINISTRATOR

This week, Glencoe Assistant Village Manager Will Jones was appointed by the Mequon, Wisconsin Common Council as the next City Administrator for the City of Mequon. He will begin his new role on January 12, 2015.

Mr. Jones has been employed by the Village of Glencoe for the past four years as Assistant Village Manager, and has had an integral role in all aspects of Village operations. Of particular note were his efforts in developing a very effective and impactful Shared Services Agreement with the Glencoe Park District; serving as Staff Liaison to the Street Ends Task Force; assisting with the negotiations and approval of a new collective bargaining agreement with the Glencoe Public Safety Department; helping to facilitate a comprehensive redrafting of the rules and regulations that govern the Public Safety Commission and the way in which they recruit new officers; facilitating the Village's electrical aggregation efforts; and, in helping to ease the transition between former Village Manager Paul Harlow and the current Village Manager Phil Kiraly.

Will's service to the Glencoe community has been underscored by his detailed, steady approach and his consummate professionalism. COMED CYCLIC TREE TRIMMING

ComEd has informed the Village that they will be performing vegetation management (tree trimming) at two locations in the Village beginning in January 2015. The vegetation management activities are a key component of ComEd's maintenance program to ensure system electrical reliability, as vegetation contact with ComEd equipment is a leading cause of outages. ComEd's contractors will be working on Feeders C921 and C925, the geographic areas of which are identified on the map below. Materials accepted include: mini-lights, C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights and extension cords.

Trees: The Village will be collecting Christmas trees from the curb every Wednesday during the month of January. This special collection does not require a landscape waste sticker. Please note, the Village cannot accept live garland and wreaths due to the significant wiring used in their assembly. These should be placed in your regular garbage.
