FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING SUMMARY – THURSDAY, MARCH 19

The Finance Committee met on March 19 to review the Fiscal Year 2015 Year End summary. The total expenditures were \$25,845,680 versus budget of \$25,889,497, this was within \$43,817 or 99.8% of the adopted budget. The total revenue was \$21,803,147 versus budget of \$21,302,722, which is \$500,425 in excess of budget or 102.3% of the adopted budget. All operating funds ended in excess of fund balance targets. Lastly, Village President Levin reviewed the recent events in Springfield, including concerns and potential impacts of Governor Rauner's proposed budget.

VILLAGE BOARD MEETING SUMMARY – THURSDAY, MARCH 19

At the March 19 Village Board Meeting, the Board accepted the Green Bay Road resurfacing contract bid results, with construction expected to begin in late spring/early summer utilizing 70% Federal funding and 30% local Motor Fuel Tax funds. In addition, a contract extension was approved with Mike Greco Landscaping for the 2015 Parkway Tree Program and bulk rock salt contract for the 2015-16 Winter Season under the Municipal Partnering Initiative.

In addition, the Board approved a Resolution authorizing a new Power Supply Agreement with Integrys Energy Services for the Village's Electricity Aggregation program and heard a report by Strand Associates on the Village's recently completed Water Supply Planning Report (see item below).

VILLAGE BOARD RECEIVES WATER SUPPLY PLANNING REPORT

Last evening at the Village Board Meeting, the Village's engineering firm Strand and Associates presented the Water Supply Planning Report to the Board of Trustees and members or the public. This report was commissioned in 2013 as a Water System Facilities review following a request for proposal (RFP) process in 2012. As the review process progressed, the agreement expanded to a Water Supply Planning Study. The objective of the report is to

provide the Village with a comprehensive review and analysis of the water treatment plant and supporting distribution water system to help identify a possible course of action for the following alternatives: Rehabilitation of the existing WTP, Construction of new WTP at the Lakefront, Construction of new WTP at inland location; and Purchase of water from a neighboring community. The presentation was followed by a short question and answer session by the Village Board.

At the conclusion of the presentation, the Village Manager outlined a community engagement process covering the next several months that will allow all stakeholders an opportunity to be fully educated on the subject matter and to allow open conversation with the public. The events will include an Open House with Village staff and representatives of Strand Associates to gather input and answer questions of residents, smaller presentations hosted by the Glencoe Community Relations Forum, continued presentations at Village Board meetings, and a designated webpage on the Village website that will allow visitors to email questions at any time. Dates will be posted to the Village website and distributed over social media and other news sources.

Likewise, questions that the Village receives via email (a designated email address has been developed - waterplant@villageofglencoe.org) will be posted to the Village's website with their associated answers. The Village also encourages residents to sign up for Glencoe Connect to stay informed on meeting dates and times.

APRIL 7, 2015 CONSOLIDATED ELECTION

FLUORIDATION COMPLIANCE AWARD

The Village received notice this week (see attached letter) that the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) has recognized the Village of Glencoe Water Plant personnel for maintaining compliance with the IDPH Fluoridation Act for calendar year 2014. Water Plant Superintendent Alex Urbanczyk will be presented with the award at the AWWA Annual Conference this month.

2015 VEHICLE / ANIMAL LICENSE AND ALARM PERMIT APPLICATION

During the past year, the Village staff has reviewed the processes and procedures associated with annual renewal vehicle licenses, pet licenses and alarm permits. The review resulted in an ordinance adopted by the Village Board on December 18, 2014 modifying the sections of the Village Code governing those programs. The changes to the process will:

- Eliminate one 1,400 piece mailing;
- Reduce associated alarm renewal administrative expense by adding the alarm permit renewal to the vehicle and pet license form;
- Simplify the application form and fee schedules intended for resident use;
- Reduce administrative time and expense associated with annual renewal processing by decreasing the amount of time required to verify the accuracy and sufficiency of information submitted and otherwise involved in the fulfillment process.

The Village is now able to offer online payment for unaltered applications. Where there are no changes, payments can be made online through the Village's website at www.villageofglencoe.org. Online payments will be accepted through the State of Illinois' EPay Program. The programming and setup costs of EPay are provided to the Village free of cost through the Illinois State Treasurer's Office. Altered applications must be returned to the Village with payment and the completed application form. Due to the set-up of EPay, the mailing of the applications has been delayed. The 2015 Vehicle/Animal License and Alarm Permit applications will be sent out soon.

VILLAGE RECEIVES AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN POPULAR ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORTING

The Government Finance Officers' Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) has given an Award for Outstanding Achievement in Popular Annual Financial Reporting to the Village of Glencoe for its Popular Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year ended February 28, 2014. This is a prestigious national award recognizing conformance with the highest standards for presentation of state and local government popular reports.

In order to receive the award a government unit must publish a Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR), whose contents conform to program standards of creativity, presentation, understandability, and reader appeal.

The award is valid for a one year period only. The Village of Glencoe has received this award for the last 6 consecutive years (fiscal years ended 2009-2014). In addition to this award, the Village has received the GFOA award for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the annual Financial Report and the

GFOA award for Distinguished Budget Presentation for Fiscal Year 2014. Our reporting standards continue to conform to the highest standards for these various programs and the Village anticipates submitting the Fiscal Year 2015 Budget, Comprehensive Annual Financial Report and Popular Annual Financial Report to GFOA for award consideration.

- 3) If the proposition is approved, the aggregate extension for 2015 will be determined by the limiting rate set forth in the proposition, rather than the otherwise applicable limiting rate calculated under the provisions of the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (commonly known as the Property Tax Cap Law).


