GREEN BAY ROAD WATER MAIN IMPROVEMENTS – TAKIFF CENTER SCHEDULED SHUTDOWN

Work is nearing completion on the Village's water main improvement project on Green Bay Road. This system improvement involves the disconnection and transferring of several mains and services from an older 6-inch main to the 12-inch main on the east side of the roadway. Upon completion of this work the 6-inch main, installed in 1908, will be abandoned between Vernon Avenue and Westley Road. In order to complete all disconnects at the south end of the project, a shut-down of the 12-inch water main is scheduled for Monday, October 13. This planned shutdown will affect one residential property and the Takiff Center, and will occur between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Village staff coordinated this planned shutdown with the Park District on Monday when the Day Care and Pre-School programs are off for the Columbus Day holiday. Traffic will be reduced to a single lane on Green Bay Road between Vernon Avenue and Old Elm Lane and flaggers will be on site.

The Village anticipates the completion of all of the Green Bay Road water main improvements, including all site restoration, by the end of October.

PARKWAY LEAF COLLECTION INFORMATION

The Village's annual Curbside Leaf Collection Program will be offered for seven weeks beginning October 13. Leaves will be collected from the parkway area in residential neighborhoods. Residents participating in the Leaf Collection Program are asked to note the following:

- Leaves should be piled in a row along the parkway in front of your property and should not be placed in the street under



any circumstance. Leaf piles in the street are a traffic hazard and clog the storm sewer basins, resulting in street flooding. A long, low row is better than a single large pile and limits the blowing of leaves into the street or back into the yard.

- The Village will be operating multiple parkway leaf collection crews continually during the program and anticipates passing through every neighborhood 4-5 times before the end of November. Residents are encouraged to check the Village website for an area-by-area map and estimated progress schedule. The final pass will be made the last week of November and the last day of collection will occur on November 30.
- Residents who use a landscape contractor to maintain their yard are urged to have the contractor remove leaves at the time their yard is serviced. Most residents who use landscape contractors are paying for disposal of leaves as part of their service.

Remember, use of gasoline powered leaf blowers is permitted September 15 through December 15. Commercial landscape maintenance contractors may operate Monday - Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Commercial landscape maintenance contractors are prohibited from working on Sundays and holidays.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

At the October 7th Historic Preservation Commission meeting, staff reported that the Village Board approved two properties as Certified Landmarks on August 21, 2014: (1) the Ross House at 1027 Meadow Road designed by Frank Lloyd Wright in 1914; and (2) the Davis House at 470 Vernon Avenue designed by Dennis Blair in 1950. The properties were approved pursuant to the Village's revised historic preservation regulations, which were amended in March 2013. Commissioners continued their discussion of the Historic Architectural Survey project, a listing of 300+ structures that includes Certified Landmarks, Honorary Landmarks, and those properties noted for their historic and architectural significance. Promotional plans for the Survey were reviewed as well. Commissioners also discussed the restoration of Ravine Bluffs Monument #3, which is budgeted to be completed in June

2015 and will conclude the restoration effort of all three monuments in the subdivision.

OCTOBER 22ND PLAN COMMISSION MEETING

As part of the Plan Commission's ongoing planning process for the Downtown Tune Up, those interested are invited to attend a presentation on economic development issues pertaining to downtown Glencoe at 7:30 PM on Wednesday, October 22nd. At that meeting, Bridget Lane, of Business Districts, Inc., an expert in this subject, together with our Village Planner Lee Brown, will lead the discussion. Specifically, remarks will include a presentation that will frame Downtown planning policy by providing information on key markets for Downtown businesses, national trends impacting local businesses, the investment associated with independent business development, and the specific geographies defining the populations most likely to be attracted to Downtown Glencoe.


