HALLOWEEN HOURS AND EVENTS



Ghouls and goblins can trick-or-treat in the Village from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Halloween (Monday, October 31). To keep Halloween safe and fun, be sure that a parent or responsible adult accompanies young children trick-or-treating, and that at least one person in the group has a working flashlight. Remember to stay on sidewalks and cross streets at intersections when possible, be sure that costumes are safe and don't limit your trick-or-treater's mobility or visibility, and to check treats at home before eating them.

Glencoe shops and businesses invite you and your children to stop in Monday, October 31st from 10 am- 5 pm for a treat and give a hearty "Halloween Hello!" Then be sure to ride your brooms over to the "Ghosts of the Garden" sponsored by the Glencoe Historical Society at 377 Park Avenue. Skeletons, witches and black cats appear among the ghosts and goblins in the Eklund Garden, where kids can view the decorations and step on the patio for treats!

POLITICAL SIGNAGE

As a reminder, no political signs may be placed within the public right-of-way, which includes parkway areas (the area commonly between the sidewalk and the street). Signage placed in these areas will be removed. Signage on private property is allowed, within the following parameters:

- Only one sign per candidate or issue is permitted per address.

- Individual signs may not exceed six square feet per sign, and may be placed no higher than four feet.
- Signs may not be illuminated.

PARKWAY LEAF COLLECTION

For daily updates on when leaf collection crews will be in your neighborhood [please visit the Village website](#). The Village's annual leaf collection program is underway and leaves will be collected from residential properties in the Village until late November. There is no need to request this service - simply pile your leaves in a row along the parkway in front of your home. To reduce leaves blowing back into your yard, the Village recommends piling leaves in a long row along the parkway, instead of a large pile. Here are some other fall yard maintenance reminders:




- The use of gasoline power leaf blowers is permitted in Glencoe from September 15 to December 15. Commercial landscape maintenance contractors may operate Monday through Friday between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., and are prohibited from working on Sundays and holidays.
- Residents who use a landscape contractor to maintain their yard are urged to have their contractor remove leaves at the time their yard is serviced.

PUMPKIN RECYCLING EVENT

Not sure what to do with your jack-o-lantern after Halloween? Why not let the Village compost it for you? Residents are encouraged to bring pumpkins to the Village for collection and delivery to a composting operation, reducing the number transported to landfills. The Public Works Department will have a designated drop off location at the Public Works Garage, 325 Temple Court from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Wednesday, November 2. FALL BACK - REMEMBER: CHANGE YOUR CLOCKS, CHANGE YOUR BATTERIES!



The Glencoe Department of Public Safety reminds residents that on Sunday, November 6, at 2:00 a.m., clocks will be moved one hour back due to daylight savings time.

It is also important to remember to change the batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors.

Batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors should be changed at least twice a year, even if the detectors are hardwired into the electrical system. In the case of hardwired detectors, the battery will keep the detector functioning in the event of a power failure.

SAVE THE DATE: GLENCOE CAUCUS TOWN MEETING - DECEMBER 6

The Glencoe Caucus invites residents to attend its 2016 Bi-Annual Glencoe Town Meeting to be held on Tuesday, December 6 at 7:30 p.m. in the Young Auditorium at Central School. Under the Caucus Plan, the Town Meeting is held every two years prior to the election of Glencoe's Village President and other elected officials, which will occur next spring. At the meeting, representatives from each of the Village's elected organizations will make short "State of the Village" presentations and the Caucus Nominating Committee will present the Caucus slate of candidates for Village President, as well as trustee candidates for the Village, Park District, Library and School Boards.

NORTHSHORE HEALTH CARE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION

In an effort to address the healthcare needs of the community, attached is a summary of NorthShore's Financial Assistance Policy. The summary includes the financial assistance eligibility criteria for both free and discounted health care opportunities, as well as contact information for submitting financial assistance applications.

Plain Language Summary of the Financial Assistance Policy

It is the policy of NorthShore University HealthSystem (NorthShore) to provide financial assistance to patients in need. NorthShore will extend emergency and medically necessary services at no cost, or at a reduced amount, to an individual who is eligible under the Financial Assistance Policy (FAP) criteria. FAP eligible patients will not be billed more for medically necessary care than the amounts generally billed (AGB) to patients who have insurance.

Eligibility for financial assistance is based on a review of income, family size, and the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). The FPL varies with the size of the family and is updated annually.

The table below provides a summary of the financial assistance eligibility criteria. Additional information on the financial assistance and presumptive eligibility criteria can be found in the FAP.

Discount on Sliding Scale	Uninsured Patients Only	401% - 600%	Based on family size and income (FPL); Available to uninsured Illinois residents with total charges of \$300 or greater	Complete application

Financial assistance documents (including the policy, summary, and application) are available on the NorthShore website at www.northshore.org/about-us/billing/financial-assistance and free paper copies are available in the hospital registration areas. A free copy of these documents can also be requested by mail or by calling the phone number listed below. These documents are also available in Spanish, Russian, Korean, and Assyrian.

Unless presumptively eligible, an application should be submitted (along with supporting documentation) by mail to the address listed below or to a hospital financial counselor as soon as possible and no later than 240 days following the first billing statement for care.
