## **FIRE PREVENTION WEEK PRESS RELEASE**

Attached is a press release from the Department of Public Safety. As part of Fire Prevention week, the Department reminds residents to Hear the Beep Where you Sleep, every bedroom needs a working smoke alarm.

## **LEAF BLOWER SEASON**

The Village's ordinances prohibit the use of gasoline-powered leaf blowers, except March 15 to May 15, and September 15 to December 15. The use of lawn maintenance equipment (such as gasoline-powered leaf blowers, lawn mowers, trimmers and other types of lawn maintenance equipment) that is plainly audible beyond the premises upon which it is being used is only permitted between the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Mondays through Fridays, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Saturdays. Use of such equipment is prohibited on Sundays.

## **SHERIDAN ROAD RESURFACING IMPROVEMENT UPDATE**

IDOT's maintenance resurfacing improvement on Sheridan Road from Lake Cook Road to Winnetka Avenue in the Villages of Glencoe and Winnetka is currently underway. Curb removal and replacement has begun within the Glencoe portion of this project. It is anticipated that all of the spot curb replacement will be completed by early in the week of October 5. Grinding of the asphalt pavement surface will begin the week of October 5. This is a moving operation and will be completed under daytime lane closures around the work zone. Bituminous transition joints will be placed at cross-streets and at the north and south ends of the project. ## **GLENCOE DRIVE WATER MAIN PROJECT**

Work will begin on the north end of this project near Green Bay Road the week of October 5. Installation will take place mostly along the east side of the street in the parkway. This new water main will be pressure tested and chlorinated and then put into service. This entire project is expected to take approximately 3 weeks.

## **PLAN COMMISSION – SEPTEMBER 30**

At the September 30th meeting, members of the Plan Commission unanimously approved a design review application for proposed improvements to the Hubbard Woods Plaza shopping center located at 63-107 Green Bay Road. The building owner's application included three components: (1) building façade enhancements; (2) site and landscape enhancements; and (3) signage. As proposed, the façade of the building will be painted light grey with white trim. New black fabric awnings will be installed above all storefront windows. New landscaping will be added to the areas adjacent to Green Bay Road and the parking lot islands. Additionally, a new monument sign will replace the existing sign at the entrance to the center. Members of the Plan Commission welcomed the investment in upgrading the aesthetics of the shopping center. The next Plan Commission meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 14th at 7:30 p.m.

### **The Glencoe Department of Public Safety Reminds Glencoe Residents:**

#### **Hear the Beep Where You Sleep. Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!**

October 1, 2015 – Location matters when it comes to your smoke alarm. That’s the message behind this year’s Fire Prevention Week campaign, “Hear the Beep Where You Sleep. Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!”

Along with firefighters and safety advocates nationwide, Glencoe Public Safety is joining forces with the nonprofit National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) during Fire Prevention Week, October 4-10, to remind local residents about the importance of having working smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement.

In a fire, seconds count. Half of home fire deaths result from fires reported at night between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. when most people are asleep. Home smoke alarms can alert people to a fire before it spreads, giving everyone enough time to get out.

According to the latest NFPA research, working smoke alarms cut the chance of dying in a fire in half. Meanwhile, three out of five fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

This year’s Fire Prevention Week campaign includes the following smoke alarm messages:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement.
- Interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home. This way, when one sounds, they all do.
- Test alarms at least monthly by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or sooner if they don't respond properly.
- Make sure everyone in the home knows the sound of the smoke alarm and understands what to do when they hear it.
- If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.
- Call the fire department from outside the home.

The Glencoe Department of Public Safety will reinforce "Hear the Beep Where You Sleep. Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!" through school visits and public education efforts during contacts with the community. Public Safety personnel will ask residents if they have a working smoke detector on each level of their home; they will then remind them to change their battery every six months with the daylight savings time change. The Glencoe Department of Public Safety will also participate in the Glencoe Park District sponsored annual "Harvest Fest" family fun fair at Kalk Park on Saturday, October 3, 2015 from 10am to 2pm. The Fire Safety education trailer will be on display, on loan from the Wilmette Fire Department. Through these educational, family-oriented activities, residents can learn more about the importance of having a working smoke alarm in every bedroom.

## Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!

Fire Prevention Week Oct. 4-10, 2015

Half of home fire deaths happen between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when most people are asleep.



Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms.

For the best protection, install interconnected smoke alarms in your home. When one sounds, they all sound.



Test alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.



Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or if they do not sound when tested.



Some people, especially children and older adults, may need help to wake up. Make sure someone will wake them if the smoke alarm sounds.



When the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.

### **Important Information Regarding Swimming Pool Pumping**

At its September 17, 2015 meeting, the Village Board of Trustees approved an ordinance that establishes the Village's legal requirements that are effective immediately for residents and/or their contractors pumping water from private swimming pools. It is critical that residents and/or their contractors follow these requirements to comply with federal and state regulations, and to avoid allowing polluted water to runoff into the Village's storm sewers and ultimately, natural bodies of water, such as Lake Michigan.

The following requirements are set forth in the ordinance:

- Prior to pumping water from a swimming pool, the resident or their contractor must obtain a permit from the Village. To apply for the permit, residents or their contractor must provide a certificate of insurance, current \$10,000 performance bond, and \$100 permit fee. Permits can generally be issued the same day, if all required documentation is provided with the permit application.
- Pumping swimming pool water without a permit will result in a work stoppage and may result in a fine and/or suspension from future pool pumping permits.
- Pool water discharged to storm sewers **must** be fully dechlorinated (chlorine concentration of 0 ppm) and be pH neutral (which is considered a pH value of 6.5 to 8.5).
- Pool water discharge must be placed in the storm sewers, and discharge into sanitary sewers is not permitted.
- After pumping water from a swimming pool, the resident or their contract must submit a certificate of compliance to the Village within 24 hours of pumping completion. Failure to do so will result in a fine and may result in suspension of future swimming pool pumping permits.
