FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING - NOVEMBER 15

The Finance Committee met on Tuesday, November 15. Discussion focused on fiscal policies that will impact the development of the Fiscal Year 2018 budget (for March 1, 2017 through February 28, 2018), including the fund balance policy, appropriate uses for the debt service fund balance, the liability deductible policy and potential uses for the Intergovernmental Risk Management Agency (IRMA) and potential uses of the IRMA excess surplus insurance contributions, inter-fund transfers and exploring increases in fees for services. The Committee is scheduled to review the preliminary Fiscal Year 2018 operating budget at the next Finance Committee meeting, which will take place at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, December 13.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING - NOVEMBER 17

At the November 17 Committee of the Whole Meeting, the Village Board received a presentation from staff on an analysis of the Village's garbage program including revenues, expenses, types of services offered and comparisons to neighboring communities. The Village Board directed staff to initiate the next phase of the analysis which will include exploring an all-curbside collection program, or a combination of curbside and backdoor collection, using Village Public Works staff or a private contractor. Review the garbage collection analysis in the Committee of the Whole meeting agenda packet. The Board also received a brief presentation on local government travel expenses and will consider an ordinance to adopt a policy for this at the December 15 Village Board meeting.

Additionally, the Village Board presented a proclamation to the Glencoe Historical Society, honoring them for receiving prestigious awards for their work on the year-long *Wright in Glencoe* program. The Village Board also approved an agreement for professional engineering services for the Green Bay Trail feasibility study, the purchase of four Cisco routers and an ordinance to increase the number of available liquor licenses, so that one may be issued to Valor Restaurant at 667 Vernon Avenue. BANK ROBBERY SUSPECT IN CUSTODY

At approximately 2 p.m. on Saturday, November 12, Glencoe Public Safety responded to a 911 call reporting a bank robbery at the Chase Bank at 45 Green Bay Road. The suspect was armed with a knife, demanded money and fled the scene on foot after obtaining an undetermined amount of U.S. currency. Glencoe detectives working jointly with the Chicago office of the FBI took the suspect into custody the afternoon of Monday, November 14.

PARKWAY LEAF COLLECTION

For daily updates on when leaf collection crews will be in your neighborhood [please visit the Village website](#). With unseasonably warm weather, leaves are falling later than expected, which means that our Public Works crews will continue passes through the Village well into December to help clear curbs and lawns before snowfall. Please continue to pile your leaves in a row along the parkway in front of your home. To reduce leaves blowing back into your yard, the Village recommends piling leaves in a long row along the parkway, instead of in a large pile. Here are some other fall yard maintenance reminders:

- The use of gasoline power leaf blowers is permitted in Glencoe from September 15 to December 15. Commercial landscape maintenance contractors may operate Monday through Friday between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., and are prohibited from working on Sundays and holidays.
- Residents who use a landscape contractor to maintain their yard are urged to have their contractor remove leaves at the time their yard is serviced.
