SHERIDAN ROAD MAINTENANCE RESURFACING UPDATE

IDOT's maintenance resurfacing improvement on Sheridan Road from Lake Cook Road to Winnetka Avenue in the Villages of Glencoe and Winnetka is nearing the final stages through the Glencoe section. Resurfacing is nearly completed with pavement marking to follow on the week of November 9. Residents are urged to use caution in the work zone. The Village thanks residents and motorists for their continued patience.

PARKWAY LEAF COLLECTON PROGRAM

The Village's annual curbside Leaf Collection Program is underway. Leaves are collected from parkways in all residential neighborhoods. Residents participating in the Leaf Collection Program are asked to note the following:

- Leaves should be piled in a row along the parkway and should not be placed in the street. Leaf piles in the street are a traffic hazard and can clog the storm sewer basins, resulting in street flooding. A long, low row is better than a single large pile and limits the blowing of leaves into the street or back onto the yard.
- The Village operates multiple parkway leaf collection crews continually during the program and anticipates passing through every neighborhood four to five times before the end of November. Residents are encouraged to check the [Village website](#) for an area-by-area map and estimated progress schedule. The final pass will be made the last week of November.
- Residents who use a landscape contractor are urged to have the contractor remove leaves at the time their yard is serviced. Most residents who use landscape contractors are paying for disposal of leaves as part of their service.



Remember, use of gasoline powered leaf blowers is permitted beginning September 15 through December 15. Commercial landscape contractors may operate Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and are prohibited from working on Sundays and holidays.

GLENCOE PUBLIC SAFETY CELEBRATES ARRIVAL OF NEW FIRE ENGINE

PUMPKIN DROP-OFF

The Public Works Department hosted a pumpkin drop-off event on Wednesday for residents to dispose of holiday pumpkins. This year's pilot program resulted in the collection of 380 pumpkins totaling 11,000 pounds that were diverted from the solid waste stream and delivered to a composting site in Antioch.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

At the November 3 meeting, members of the Historic Preservation Commission discussed the Preservation Awards Program and reviewed the nine award recipients in the categories of Restoration, Renovation, Addition, and New Construction. Commissioners discussed a variety of promotional efforts including a press release, articles in the *Glencoe Quarterly* and on the Village website, and a photo exhibit showcasing the award-winning projects. Commissioners also continued discussion on the historic architectural survey project. The next Historic Preservation Commission meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 1 at 7:30 p.m.

PLAN COMMISSION

At the November 4 meeting, members of the Plan Commission continued discussion on the Downtown Tune Up planning process. Village Planner Lee Brown presented a series of planning maps documenting existing and proposed conditions within and surrounding the downtown area. It was emphasized that the maps were only in the draft stage and would continue to be fine-tuned with input from the Plan Commission. Commissioners also discussed their October 28 meeting held at the Glencoe Historical Society for a special presentation and exhibit of the 1912 collaboration between Frank Lloyd Wright and Jens Jensen on a design for Glencoe's downtown. CELEBRATING THE ARRIVAL OF OUR NEW E-ONE FIRE ENGINE AND THE RETIREMENT OF OUR 1981 AMERICAN LAFRANCE FIRE ENGINE

On November 5, 2015, Glencoe took delivery of a new fire engine; its tenth motorized fire engine in the last 100 years. With the delivery of the new E-ONE Typhoon engine, the current reserve fire engine, a 1981 American LaFrance Century Edition pumper, was donated to the Northern Illinois Fire Museum <http://www.nifm.net/> located in Marengo, Illinois. At the museum, it will be maintained and displayed with pride by the dedicated volunteer museum staff and loaned back to Glencoe for ceremonies and parades.

A small ceremony was held to celebrate the arrival of the new engine and the retirement of the old engine. The ceremony included members of the Glencoe Historical Society, local media, residents, local firefighters, and current and retired Glencoe Public Safety Officers.
