POLICE PENSION FUND BOARD MEETING – APRIL 22

The Police Pension Board met on April 22 and reviewed financial activity as of January 1, 2015. During the quarter the portfolio increased from \$31.2 Million to \$31.6 Million. Equities represented 53% of the portfolio, fixed income represented 45% of the portfolio and cash represented 2% of the portfolio. The Board invests funds to the limits allowed by the State of Illinois. The Board reviewed and approved the investment instructions and the Investment Guideline Overview contained in the Quarterly Report. The Board also authorized the acceptance of new Public Safety Officers Jonathan Boersema and Derek Mortensen into the Police Pension Fund. Lastly, the Board approved quarterly payments and disbursements. The Board meets quarterly and will meet again this summer.

PLAN COMMISSION – APRIL 22

At the April 22 meeting, members of the Plan Commission unanimously approved a design review application for exterior modifications to the existing one story masonry building at 376 Park Avenue in the downtown business district. The building was originally constructed in 1974 as a medical office and was most recently the box office for Writers Theatre. New owners, David and Andrea Goldman, plan to reconfigure the interior into the showroom, offices, and studio space for Andrea Goldman Design. On the exterior several modifications are proposed that will enhance the design of the building. An outdoor courtyard with landscaping will be added behind the existing front building wall visible to pedestrians through two 6' X 7' openings designed to look like windows. An exterior stair will be installed within the courtyard leading to a newly constructed roof deck. The primary building material will remain brick, painted white, with added decorative elements including awnings, planter boxes, and exterior light fixtures. The proposed modifications meet all Village building and zoning requirements. Construction is expected to begin this summer.
