NATIONAL DRUG TAKE BACK DAY

The Drug Enforcement Administration has scheduled its eighth annual National Drug Take Back Day for Saturday, April 26, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. This National Take Back will provide another unified opportunity for the public to safely dispose of pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications that were not previously collected or have accumulated since their last event.



The Glencoe Department of Public Safety has partnered with the DEA again this year and will serve as a local collection point. The national response to these events has been overwhelmingly positive. To date, agencies throughout the United States have removed more than 3.4 million pounds (1,733 tons) of medication from circulation.

Burn Camp invites young burn survivors to share their experiences while being able to play and not feel self-conscious about how others may react to their scars.

The Burn Camp volunteer staff includes fire service personnel as well as doctors, nurses, social workers, child life, physical, and occupational therapists, Camp Duncan counselors, and adult burn survivors.

METRA INCIDENT

At approximately 6:00 a.m. on April 24, 2014, Metra personnel reported seeing an unidentified male subject on the ground near the Union Pacific / Metra railroad tracks in Glencoe, south of the train station at Park Avenue. Glencoe Public Safety personnel responded and located the subject on railroad property south of Hazel Avenue; the subject was unconscious and breathing. The initial investigation indicates that the subject may have fallen while walking near the railroad tracks, causing a laceration to his the head. It does not appear that he was struck by a train. Glencoe Paramedics transported the subject to Evanston Hospital.

Metra and Union Pacific officials arrived on scene and are assisting with the investigation.

The subject has been identified as 49 year old David DiPaolo of Winnetka. Investigators have been unable to speak with Mr. DiPaolo due to his medical condition.

POLICE PENSION FUND BOARD

The Glencoe Police Pension Fund Board conducted its quarterly meeting on April 23, 2014. The Board reviewed the current state of the pension fund which is good financial condition. The Board also reviewed investments, the status and sufficiency of banking services, quarterly payments and disbursements, and approved actions related to the status of annuitants and members of the funds. The Board also approved a revised investment policy which will allow investment in equities up to 65% subject to statutory limits. The next Police Pension Fund Board meeting will be held on July 16, 2014 at 7:00 a.m.

PLAN COMMISSION

At the April 23 Plan Commission meeting, Commissioners reviewed a revised proposal on the planning process for updating Chapter 10 of the Comprehensive Plan, entitled *Downtown Subarea Strategic Plan*. The revisions incorporated comments received from Commissioners since the April 9th meeting, as well as input from Village staff. The proposed framework for the plan update calls for Plan Commission meetings to be organized into a series of workshops that would each focus on a broad topic relevant to downtown – land use, economic development, housing, public spaces, parking and circulation, etc. Each workshop would include a list of questions agreed upon by Commissioners intended to seek answers from the community. Panel discussions with invited participants, included as part of the workshops or as stand-alone meetings, would assure broad representation of perspectives and encourage involvement. The planning process will begin with a Plan Commission walkabout downtown intended to identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats and conclude with an identification of specific action steps necessary to induce recommended changes. Public outreach and participation will be paramount to the process and a variety of modes for doing so were identified by staff and Commissioners.
