VILLAGE WATER SYSTEM PLANNING REPORT PUBLIC MEETINGS

Residents are invited to attend any of three upcoming meetings to discuss the Village's 86-year old water treatment plant. A mailing was sent to all Glencoe residents this week outlining the following meeting schedule:

Open House Meeting:

The Village will host an Open House on Thursday, May 28, 2015 at 7 p.m. at Village Hall.

At the Open House, Village staff will provide a brief overview presentation, and staff will be on-hand to listen to comments and answer questions related to specific topics, which will be discussed in break-out sessions.

Forum Discussions:

The Glencoe Community Relations Forum will host two Community Forums:

- Monday, June 8, 2015 at 7 p.m. at the Glencoe Union Church
- Saturday, June 27, 2015 at 10 a.m. at the Glencoe Public Library

These discussions are meant to be informal opportunities for residents to learn about the water treatment plant options that were presented to the Village Board in March, and to engage in an open, informal dialogue about the water treatment plant in general. Community Forums will include

information presented by Village staff, and Village staff will engage in an open dialogue with residents to hear questions and comments, moderated by the Glencoe Community Relations Forum.

The Village is in the early stages of a lengthy process to gather and evaluate information relative to the water treatment plant options, and wishes to listen to questions and feedback from residents throughout the evaluation process. The Village is currently conducting a more detailed evaluation of the options presented in March, to better understand the full costs and the potential impacts to Glencoe homeowners. The information gathering and evaluation process is expected to last more than one year, and there will be numerous additional opportunities for engagement in this process before the Village Board considers a final recommendation. No formal actions will be taken or decisions made at these meetings; rather, the focus of the meetings will be to share information, answer questions, and receive comments, which Village staff will summarize and post on the Village's water system update web page (www.villageofglencoe.org/news/wtpinitiative.aspx) and share with the Village Board.

PLAN COMMISSION – MAY 13

At the May 13th meeting, members of the Plan Commission unanimously approved two design review applications. The first was for building owner Kevin Campbell to replace the existing divided light single-pane storefront windows and framing with new insulated plate glass units and framing at 667 Vernon Avenue. This space was formerly occupied by Dewey's and will house new Italian restaurant Cibo Trattoria. The second was for Writers Theatre for its exterior signage. The proposed sign package includes three primary

elements, all of which face Tudor Court. They include a backlit 'Writers Theatre' wall sign, a second, much smaller wall sign identifying a potential donor, and a freestanding ground sign constructed of stainless steel and in the shape of the letters 'WT'. An evening rendering of the building and signage is below. The next Plan Commission meeting is scheduled for 7:00 PM on Wednesday, June 3rd.



COMMUNITY RELATIONS FORUM – MAY 13
