CELEBRATE THE 4TH OF JULY IN GLENCOE

July 4th is a great time to get together with family, friends and neighbors. In Glencoe, residents of all ages can take part in a full day of festivities on Saturday, July 4.

- 8 a.m.: 2-Mile Rotary Fun Run (Starts at the Train Station)
- 10 a.m.: Village Art Fair (Wyman Green)
- 10 a.m.: Preschool and Family Games (Kalk Park)

- 12 p.m.: Glencoe's Got Talent (Kalk Park)
- 2 p.m.: July 4th Village Parade (Starts at Central School)
- 4 p.m.: Concessions by Red Hen (Lakefront Park)
- 6-10 p.m.: Park and Ride to Lakefront Park starts
(Village and Train parking lots)
- 6 p.m.: Music by Shout Out (Lakefront Park)
- 9 p.m.: Fireworks Start (Lakefront Park)

The day will kick off at 8 AM with the annual 2-Mile Fun Run, which is co-sponsored/organized by the Glencoe Rotary Club. The run starts at the Glencoe train depot and twists throughout town. To save time, we recommend you register in advance for the free race. Prizes will be awarded for each age category. Family Games follow at Kalk Park from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. Preschool-aged children will enjoy games like the Duck Splash, Bozo Buckets, Bean Bag Ring Toss, Bowling and Spray Bottles. Slightly older children can participate in games like Crazy Water Cup Relay, Balloon Relay, Mummy Wrap, Eating Races, and Egg Toss.

The Village of Glencoe's Art Fair at Wyman Green will take place from 10 AM to 4 p.m. Local vendors and artists display their work at booths stretched across the green. This event is always a nice highlight for adults, as residents eagerly look forward to browsing the unique art pieces. Do you have a special talent you would like to share with your friends and neighbors? If so, you need to be part of Glencoe's Got Talent at 12 p.m. at Kalk Park! The sixth annual talent show will feature performers of all ages and talents, including singers, musicians, and dancers. Please fill out an entry form and drop it off either at Village Hall, the Glencoe Public Library, or the Takiff Center. Admission is free and open to all; the deadline to participate is June 29 by 5 p.m.

The annual July 4th Parade takes place at 2 p.m., which showcases Glencoe families, neighborhoods, camp groups, and local organizations. All residents have the opportunity to participate. If your group is interested, meet at Central School (620 Greenwood) to line up for this one-of-a-kind small town parade, which follows a neighborhood route through downtown Glencoe.

At 6 p.m., Glencoe residents and non-residents can take advantage of the Park & Ride to the Lakefront Park. Families can park at either the Village lot or train lot and take the free bus shuttle to Lakefront Park. Throughout the evening, food will be available for purchase from Red Hen at Lakefront Park. With a repertoire of songs from the 50s to today's Top 40, the band Shout Out will kick off festivities at 6 p.m. at Lakefront Park. Shout Out's fun mix of music will get you dancing like there's no tomorrow. To cap off the July 4th festivities, a spectacular Fireworks show will be launched from the sand at 9 p.m. You can watch the enhanced show at Lakefront Park!

PLEASE NOTE: As a safety precaution, Glencoe Beach will be CLOSED on July 4 in order to prepare for the fireworks show. Glencoe Beach tokens will be honored at Maple Avenue and Elder Lane beaches in Winnetka. Glencoe Park District residents without tokens will be assessed the Winnetka Park District

resident rate (\$5) with proof of residency required. All non-resident guests will be required to pay the non-resident fee (\$10).

ILLINOIS FIRE SAFETY ALLIANCE “I AM ME” CAMP

On Wednesday, June 24, Village of Glencoe Public Safety staff members participated in a Camp “I Am Me” fire apparatus parade and appreciation day event in Ingleside, Illinois. The event was part of the annual one week “I Am Me” camp experience that is sponsored by the Illinois Fire Safety Alliance (IFSA) to benefit children and teenagers who have experienced injuries from burns. Since 1991, the IFSA has been providing this safe, non-judgmental environment for children to have the opportunity to build their self-esteem as they enjoy the varied activities that make up their camp experience. Through the generosity of donors, supporters, and volunteers, the IFSA offers this camping opportunity at

no-cost to campers; including lodging, meals, activities, and transportation to and from camp (YMCA Camp Duncan - Ingleside, IL). Prior to the event, Public Safety members held a “fill the boot” campaign in downtown Glencoe to raise funds for the camp. On Wednesday, Public Safety members presented a donation check for \$1,372.00 to the IFSA to support the program. VILLAGE MANAGER NAMED ICMA CREDENTIALLED MANAGER

Mr. Kiraly has over 13 years of service to the field of local government management, and has served as the Village Manager in Glencoe since December 2013, Glencoe’s eighth Village Manager since becoming the first community in the State of Illinois to utilize the Council/Manager form of government in 1914.

PLAN COMMISSION – JUNE 23

At the June 23rd meeting, members of the Plan Commission voted in favor of a recommendation approving a preliminary and final plat for the consolidation of two properties – 205 Franklin Road and 221 Sylvan Road – into a single zoning lot. Currently both properties are separate zoning lots, each improved with a single family home built in the 1920s, and located in the Ravine Bluffs Subdivision. Owner of both properties, Richard Ruzich, will retain the existing residence at 205 Franklin Road and will demolish the existing 1 ½-story house at 221 Sylvan Road, which will then be landscaped for use as an expanded yard. No further improvements are proposed at this time. The proposed lot size of the combined properties will be 54,004.57 square feet. Pending final approval of the Village Board, demolition and site restoration is expected to begin this summer. The next Plan Commission meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, July 22nd.
