CELEBRATE THE 4TH OF JULY IN GLENCOE

The Glencoe Park District together with the Village of Glencoe invites the community to join friends and neighbors and take part in a full day of activities on Friday, July 4th!

Please note that Lakefront Park is the new Fireworks Viewing Area and that as a safety precaution, Glencoe Beach will be **CLOSED** on July 4 in order to prepare for the fireworks show. Glencoe Beach tokens will be honored at Maple Avenue and Elder Lane beaches in Winnetka. Glencoe residents without tokens will be given the Winnetka Park District resident rate (\$5) with proof of residency required. All non-resident guests will be required to pay the non-resident fee (\$10).

The following street closures will be in effect from July 3 at 10:00pm through July 5 at 6:00am:

- Hazel and Park Avenues (Street end to Longwood)
- Longwood (between Hazel and Park Avenues)

There will be no parking on Hazel and Park Avenues east of Green Bay Road on July 4. Other parking restrictions may be posted.

PLAN COMMISSION

At the June 25th Plan Commission meeting, discussion continued on the planning process for the Downtown Tune-up. Village Planner Lee Brown presented photos taken and submitted by Commissioners as part of the “SWOT analysis”, a structured process used in strategic planning to identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats, and highlighted the main themes recognized by Commissioners as they relate to downtown Glencoe. The photos were taken in advance of the Plan Commission’s downtown walking tour on May 28, which officially kicked off the Downtown Tune-up. Additional time was also spent reviewing a draft schedule of meetings, panels, and events intended to ensure a comprehensive planning process with multiple opportunities for public engagement. A demo of the project website – www.GlencoeTuneup.com – was provided and sample posters for the downtown kiosks were shared.

DOWNTOWN PLAN – COMMUNITY IDEAS CHALKBOARD

The Village’s Downtown Plan discussion is just beginning and this week a new approach to encouraging public engagement took shape on Wyman Green, between the Village Hall and Library. The Village borrowed an idea from community planner and



artist, Candy Chang who has used public chalkboards to gather ideas and creative solutions about neighborhoods and business districts all over the US and across the world. Asking the question “Downtown Glencoe would be better if...”, this “Community Ideas” chalkboard is a great opportunity for the community to interact with the downtown plan process and contribute ideas and suggestions. Intended as an idea and conversation starter, the chalkboard will remain in place through the summer months and written ideas and suggestions will be logged and forwarded to the Plan Commission.

RABID BAT FOUND IN GLENCOE

The Cook County Department of Animal and Rabies Control has informed the Village that on June 24, 2014, a bat found near the 100 block of Beach Road was submitted for rabies testing and found to be rabid by the Illinois State Public Health Laboratory.

Residents are reminded not to handle bats, skunks, or other wild animals. If you have been exposed to or bitten by a bat, contact your doctor immediately. Residents should also keep their pets on a leash when outdoors and be sure that all pets have a current rabies vaccination.

WEST NILE VIRUS DETECTED IN MOSQUITOS IN GLENCOE

The North Shore Mosquito Abatement District (NSMAD) has found the first West Nile virus positive mosquito pool to occur in Glencoe this year on June 20, 2014, although no cases have been reported.

The Village of Glencoe and NSMAD remind residents to protect themselves by practicing the following:

- Avoid outdoor activity around dawn and dusk
- Cover exposed skin with loose fitting, light colored clothing
- Use insect repellent

Residents should also check around homes and eliminate potential mosquito breeding sources, particularly any items that can hold water. If it can hold water, it can breed mosquitoes.

NSMAD will be conducting targeted adult mosquito control operations in Glencoe on Monday, June 30 between the hours of 8:00pm and 2:00pm, weather permitting.

UPDATE ON FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT
RAVINE BLUFFS MONUMENT RESTORATION



Smith Art Conservation began restoration work Monday, June 23rd on Monument 2 located at the northwest corner of Franklin Rd and Meadow Rd. The proposed restoration treatment will include manually removing the Thorocoat covering to expose the original aggregate finish, installing a newly fabricated copper liner and drainpipe to the spherical planter, filling chipped corners

and minor losses with custom matched concrete/aggregate blend, sealing cracks with epoxy injection, and coating the entire exterior with a waterproofing compound. Work is expected to be completed by the end of next week.
