DUNDEE ROAD DETOUR BEGINS ON MONDAY, JUNE 6

Beginning Monday, June 6, Dundee Road will be closed to all through traffic from Forestway Drive to Bluff Road. Please use the approved detour route if travel takes you east- or west-bound on Dundee Road. East-bound traffic will be detoured from Forestway Drive to Westley Road and then to Green Bay Road; west-bound traffic will be detoured from Green Bay Road to Westley Road and then to Forestway Drive. To view a map highlighting the detour route, click [here](#). The work is expected to last for approximately two weeks and the Village urges motorists and pedestrians to use alternate routes. This detour will allow crews to complete the final segment of storm water improvements in the Skokie Ridge area. These storm sewer improvements were part of the projects approved by Village residents via referendum in April 2015.

Please remember to follow the posted speed limits and watch for construction workers when traveling by the construction area. 2016 VEHICLE LICENSE STICKER REMINDER

Every vehicle that is registered in the Village of Glencoe is required to have a Village sticker. Village Ordinance requires that the sticker be displayed and properly affixed to the passenger-side windshield by

May 1. In March, a pre-printed annual vehicle license application form was mailed to residents. Residents who have not yet purchased vehicle stickers are urged to submit the license application to receive 2016 vehicle stickers. If a resident's vehicle information has not changed, vehicle sticker payment can be made online at www.villageofglencoe.org. Residents whose vehicle information has changed must return the updated application to the Village with payment by mail or in person at Village Hall. If a resident no longer owns a vehicle previously licensed in the Village, the resident must provide proof that he or she no longer owns the vehicle.

If a valid sticker is not displayed in the vehicle's passenger-side windshield, the vehicle owner may be subject to a late payment penalty and a citation from the Public Safety Department. The Public Safety Department is conducting vehicle sticker enforcement.

Skokie Ridge Storm Basin Improvements

New storm sewer has been installed north of Dundee Road and Sunset Lane, between Oak Ridge Drive and Elm Ridge Drive, which includes Bluff Road, Sunset Lane and Eastwood Road. The final segment of work will begin the week of June 6 on Dundee Road between Forest Way Drive and Bluff Road. **While the work is underway, traffic will be detoured from Forest Way Drive to Westley Road and then to Green Bay Road.** The work is expected to be completed in two weeks, weather permitting. These storm sewer improvements were part of the projects approved by Village residents via referendum in April 2015.

Traffic control is posted in each area restricting vehicular traffic to local traffic only during the daytime. Remember to please be cautious whether walking, biking or driving in a work zone!

Terrace Court Storm Basin Improvements

All work has been completed in the Terrace Court basin area. This work included installing a storm water separation structure where the storm sewer systems are discharging under the Union Pacific railroad. This storm water separation structure has multiple chambers that filters debris and small trash from storm water flow and is considered a best management practice for storm water discharge.

MWRD Repairs on Old Green Bay Road

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) is working to repair the collapse on its sewer manhole on Old Green Bay Road. Crews have completed drilling operations and are working to complete the final excavation by hand. After this work has been completed, MWRD crews will pour the concrete structure base of the manhole. The project is expected to be completed in early July.

As a reminder, Old Green Bay Road remains closed to through traffic from Park Avenue to Maple Hill Road. Lincoln Drive, Crescent Drive and Walden Drive will remain open and accessible from Old Green Bay Road to the north and south of the project area. Pedestrian and bicycle traffic can also safely pass the construction area by accessing the sidewalk just east of the roadway between Lincoln Avenue and Walden Avenue. Sheridan Road Maintenance Resurfacing

IDOT is continuing to work on its Sheridan Road resurfacing project. The remaining work in the Village includes the final restoration of the right-of-way north of Aspen Lane and is expected to be completed by mid-June. Pavement markings and signage for the new bicycle lane has been completed.

Green Bay Road Median Work at Tudor Court

Village crews are continuing work on the construction of a new pedestrian crossing that will connect the Village train station parking lot and the west side of Green Bay Road (just north of Tudor Court). This important improvement will allow pedestrians to safely cross Green Bay Road and provides a safe access point for patrons of Writers Theatre who park in the train station lots. Crews will be installing signage and pavement markings next week. Please use

caution and reduce your speed while traveling through the construction zone. Thank you for your patience during this project.

NOTHBROOK DUNDEE ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Village staff has been advised by Northbrook that IDOT plans to begin grinding the asphalt surface of Dundee Road from Portwine Road to I-94 (the Edens) beginning tomorrow, Saturday, June 4. Northbrook staff said it expects this work will continue through September. Please plan travel through this area accordingly and remember to obey the posted speed limit and watch for construction crews when traveling through the area.

50/50 TREE PROGRAM UPDATE

This past winter, the Village removed more than 200 dead or diseased ash trees along the southern most section of the Green Bay Trail between Harbor Street and Scott Avenue. To address this, the Village has partnered with the Friends of the Green Bay Trail (FGBT) and planned an extensive re-planting program for this area over the next three years which includes an opportunity for residents to partner with the Village in the cost of re-planting trees on the Green Bay Trail. As a part of this plan, the Village will pay for 50% of any tree that is donated to the trail at this location. This opportunity is an addition to the Village's annual 50/50 cost sharing tree program.

For more than 25 years, the Village has provided a 50/50 cost-sharing parkway tree planting program. This program provides residents a 50/50 cost sharing opportunity with the Village for the planting of trees in public parkways. Additionally, the program includes an opportunity for residents to purchase trees for planting on private property. While residents are responsible for the cost of planting trees on private property, they are able to take advantage of Village-negotiated rates for the trees.

LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN



TRAIN STATION SAFETY



On Thursday, June 9, 2016, between 4:40 am and 9:00 am the Glencoe Department of Public Safety will join the Metra Police Department in an Operation Lifesaver Station Safety Blitz campaign. The event will take place at the Glencoe Metra Station located at 724 Green Bay Road. The Station Safety Blitz Program is part of an ongoing safety education effort designed to enhance public awareness to the potential hazards of disregarding pedestrian railroad warning devices. Glencoe and Metra police officers will engage commuters by distributing educational materials related to train and grade crossing safety. Commuters will also have an opportunity to ask train safety questions or express any safety concerns they may have.

These regular and systematic safety campaigns at commuter train stations have been effective in reducing the number of train related incidents. They serve as a reminder that safe and lawful conduct around railroad crossings is vital. Remember that trains always win – don't violate warning signals! LOOK, LISTEN, LIVE!

LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN



On Sunday, June 5, 2016 from approximately 9:30 am to 10:30 am, Glencoe Public Safety Officers will participate in the 30th annual Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics Illinois. Glencoe officers along with officers from other police agencies will run through Glencoe via Green Bay Road from Lake Cook Road to Scott Avenue.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run® is the single largest year-round fundraising event benefiting Special Olympics Illinois. The annual intrastate relay and its various fundraising projects have two goals: to raise money and to gain awareness for the athletes who participate in Special Olympics Illinois. The Law Enforcement Torch Run® has raised more than \$39 million over 30 years while increasing awareness of Special Olympics Illinois athletes and their accomplishments.

Approximately 3,000 officers representing every branch of law enforcement across the state from local police officers to FBI agents will carry the Flame of Hope nearly 1,500 miles, running through thousands of Illinois communities via 23 different legs (routes) to its final destination – the Opening Ceremony of the Special Olympics Illinois Summer Games in June in Normal.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run has selected “Guarding the Flame Since 1986” as the theme for 2016 and will be using #ILTorchRun30 on social media to inspire officers and departments to spread the word about the 30th anniversary and how the Torch Run transforms the lives of Special Olympics athletes in Illinois.
