### RECENT BURGLARY ARREST

The Public Safety Department arrested a residential burglary suspect during the early morning hours of June 29. Officers responded to 911 call from the resident of the 400 block of Lakeside Terrace for a burglary in progress and determined after their arrival that the offender had fled.

Shortly thereafter, officers located an individual matching the description of the suspect on foot near the Glencoe train station. The suspect, Christopher Puente, 30, of the 900 block of Lawrence Ave., Chicago, was taken into custody, questioned, and charged with residential burglary and burglary to motor vehicle. He was also linked to another recent Glencoe residential burglary, and taken to the Cook County District 2 Courthouse in Skokie, where bond was set at \$100,000 and next appearance on July 17.

### **Green Bay Road Pedestrian Crossing at Tudor Court**



The new pedestrian crossing through the median on Green Bay Road just north of Tudor Court has been completed and is open for use. Commuters, patrons of the downtown and Writers Theatre are encouraged to use this crosswalk as an alternative to the signalized intersection crosswalks at Green Bay Road and Park Avenue.

### **MWRD Repairs on Old Green Bay Road, Road Closure Update**

The new access manhole being constructed by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) on Old Green Bay Road north of the Metra station has been completed; however, Old Green Bay Road will remain closed to through traffic until remaining work is completed in mid-July. While Old Green Bay Road is closed, pedestrians and bicycles may safely use the sidewalk along the east side of Old Green Bay Road. MWRD crews are installing new sewer pipe to connect the Village's sewer system to the new manhole, and final pavement restoration is expected to be completed by mid-July.

### **ELEVATED WATER TANK MAINTENANCE**

The Village's elevated water tank on Frontage Road just west of the Edens Expressway was put back into full service on June 29. The tank was isolated from the water distribution system and emptied last month for maintenance, cleaning and inspection of the interior, and the repainting of the exterior. The 500,000-gallon steel tank was originally constructed in 1931.




### **RAILROAD TRACK MAINTENANCE IN GLENCOE**

Union Pacific Railroad is performing routine railroad track maintenance in Glencoe between the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m., beginning the evening of June 30 and ending the morning of July 3. The work is not expected to generate noise, but it will create sparks on the tracks. Please do not be alarmed should you witness sparks near Union Pacific work trucks on the tracks, as this work is routine maintenance.

### **COMED TREE TRIMMING**

Trees and branches that interfere with power lines can create safety hazards and cause power outages. Preventative tree maintenance helps avoid power outages. Beginning in July and throughout the following three months, ComEd will trim trees, branches and vines in Glencoe that interfere or have the potential to interfere with power lines.
