JULY 6 PLAN COMMISSION MEETING

At the July 6 Plan Commission meeting, Commissioners continued discussion of the Downtown TuneUp planning process; specifically, the two community open houses that were held on May 21 and 25. Village Planner Lee Brown summarized general themes that emerged from feedback from the open houses, and Commissioners shared feedback from open house attendees. It was agreed that the feedback from the open houses supported the recommendations currently included in the discussion draft of Chapter 10: Downtown Sub-Area Plan. Commissioners will continue their review of the discussion draft with the intent of submitting it to the Village Board for consideration following the July 27 Plan Commission meeting.

PUBLIC SAFETY CRIME PREVENTION NOTICE

The Department of Public Safety has issued a crime prevention notice following recent vehicle burglaries and thefts. Perpetrators target unlocked vehicles for burglaries and unlocked vehicles with keys inside them for thefts. MWRD Repairs on Old Green Bay Road, Road Closure Update

As a reminder, Old Green Bay Road remains closed to through traffic until mid-July. The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) completed construction on a new access manhole last week and MWRD crews are now installing new sewer pipe to connect the Village's sewer system to the new manhole. While Old Green Bay Road is closed, pedestrians and bicycles may safely use the sidewalk along the east side of Old Green Bay Road.

Sidewalk Replacement Program

Work has begun on the Village's annual residential sidewalk and curb replacement program and is expected to be completed by early fall 2016.



The work will take place in pocket areas north of Dundee Road and west of Hohlfelder Road (Area One), as well as other priority areas around Central School, focusing on sections of sidewalks and curbs that have deteriorated.

CYCLIC TREE TRIMMING

Over the next month, Public Works crews will trim trees located on public parkways on the following streets:

- Country Lane
- Redwood Lane
- Brookvale Terrace
- Bluff Street
- Brookside Lane
- Ivy Lane
- Grove Street

Cyclic trimming and pruning of parkway trees maintains the health and structure of mature trees by removing dead, dying and diseased branches, and reduces the

potential hazard of low-hanging or falling branches. All trimming performed by the Village is done in accordance with national arboricultural standards under the direction of a trained and certified arborist.



COMED TREE TRIMMING

Trees and branches that interfere with power lines can create safety hazards and cause power outages. Preventative tree maintenance helps avoid power outages. Beginning in July and throughout the following three months, ComEd will trim trees, branches and vines in Glencoe that interfere or have the potential to interfere with power lines. All work is performed by ComEd's trained vegetation management crews and contractors. This program is separate from the Village's cyclic tree trimming program.
