SHERIDAN ROAD EMERGENCY CLOSURE UPDATE

Sheridan Road has been reopened. The recent excavation has been backfilled and a concrete sub-base has been poured. Asphalt surface work is still being completed, and is expected to be complete early during the week of August 18. In the interim, the excavation has been plated and the road reopened to traffic. However, Hazel Avenue on the east side of the intersection remains closed until asphalt surface is completed next week. A brief, daytime detour will take place next week when the asphalt surface work is completed.

The Village and IDOT thank everyone for their patience and cooperation during this emergency repair project.

DOWNTOWN BUSINESS DISTRICT STREET RESURFACING UPDATE

Over the past week, Vernon Avenue, Park Avenue and Village Court have been milled to remove the existing asphalt layer. The first layer of new asphalt was installed on these streets on Thursday, August 14. Over the coming week, the next phase is adjusting manholes up to the level of the final layer of asphalt. The contractor will place asphalt around those manholes to ease traffic flow around them. Depending on weather conditions, the final layer of asphalt may be installed by the end of the week of August 18 along with all new pavement markings.




DOWNTOWN GLENCOE WOULD BE BETTER IF...


