## **GLENCOE GOLF CLUB'S 8<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL GLENCOE OPEN**

The 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Glencoe Open was held September 13-14 with over 50 players participating in the 36-hole cumulative, stroke play event. Glenview resident Joe Zawaski shot a first round 68 on a rain-soaked golf course which played unusually longer than normal. Joe followed up his 68 with a final round 75 to win the Championship Flight over runner-up Ralph Houck and third place finisher Michael Treitler.

Kirk Blakney shot a pair of net 67 rounds to win the A Flight with Scott Muir and Ryan Czir taking second and third place honors respectively.

Brandon Mitchell (pictured at right), a 16-year-old Glencoe resident and New Trier student, fired a Saturday round net 67 to take a 2 shot lead in the B Flight after the first round. Brandon shot a final round net 73 to win the flight over Dwanye Laskey by 7 strokes. Glencoe resident Ben Gutstein won third place in the B Flight in a scorecard playoff over Wilmette resident Steve Kolmin.

## **HUMAN RELATIONS FORUM**

The Village Human Relations Forum met on September 17<sup>th</sup>. The main topic of the meeting was to clarify the mission of the Forum. In recent months, newly appointed Forum members and the Chairperson have debated the role

of the Forum in Village affairs. Based on those discussions, as well as input from Village leadership, the defined Forum mission going forward will be to facilitate venues for the Village to interact with the community on a variety of public initiatives including the Village Comprehensive Plan, the Water Plant Project, and Writers Theatre construction. As the Village contemplates and plans public projects, the Forum will host public meetings as necessary. The goal is to bring members of the community together with topic experts and Village Board members for moderated discussions, allowing all stakeholders to share their opinions and concerns. Forum members are enthusiastic about the newly defined role and look forward to coordinating with Village staff as they fulfill their role in the public outreach aspect of Village government.

### **FINANCE COMMITTEE**

The Finance Committee of the Village Board of Trustees met on September 18<sup>th</sup> and reviewed long range capital inventory items for the Village, which is a list of capital assets that Village staff recommends enhancing or replacing in the coming years, the cost of each, and how this synchronizes with other Village plans, including the draft strategic plan. The Committee expressed interest in continuing discussion at next month's meeting which will be held prior to the Village Board Meeting on Thursday, October 16<sup>th</sup>.

### **VILLAGE BOARD MEETING**

At the September 18<sup>th</sup> Village Board Meeting, the Board approved the Village's first-ever collective bargaining agreement with the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council #803. A press release is attached.



Also at the meeting, three new Public Safety Officers were sworn in – Daniel Minogue, Andrew Leverentz and Bryan Kryszewski. Public Safety Director Cary Lewandowski introduced each new officer and their family members in attendance. He explained that all three officers were ranked high on the Village's

eligibility list and would be commencing their employment soon.

Additionally, the Board heard a presentation from the Glencoe Historical Society regarding reconstruction of the Frank Lloyd Wright waiting station near Green Bay Road and Maple Hill Road. The station was originally located along the old North Shore Electric train line but was demolished after the line's decommission. The Historical Society explained how it is interested in reconstructing the station to commemorate the centennial anniversary of the Frank Lloyd Wright Ravine Bluffs subdivision.

Other items on the agenda included a presentation of the Village's Draft Strategic Plan, a presentation on and the adoption of updated Freedom of Information Act Rules and Regulations, and a discussion of a potential ordinance regarding zoning restrictions for medical marijuana dispensaries in the Village, in which no action was taken.

The next Village Board Meeting will be on Thursday, October 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m.

### **GLENCOE AND ILLINOIS FOP REACH LABOR AGREEMENT**

**Glencoe, IL** – The Village of Glencoe and the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police (FOP) Labor Council #803 have reached agreement on terms of an initial four-year collective bargaining agreement, which expires on February 28, 2017.

The new agreement includes provisions on wages, hours of work and benefits, and applies to the Village's twenty-four (24) full-time officers employed within the Department of Public Safety. Village Manager Philip Kiraly described the agreement as fair to both sides, and commended the FOP for its professionalism and commitment to the Village during the course of negotiations, which commenced in early 2013. FOP Field Representative Joe Kalita indicated that the Union's members voted overwhelmingly to approve the new agreement, and that the Union looks forward to building upon an already amicable relationship with the Village. Additionally, he acknowledged the efforts of the local Public Safety Officers' bargaining team that worked to reach this Agreement. The Glencoe Village Board of Trustees voted to approve the new agreement on September 18, 2014.
