TRUSTEE TRENT CORNELL RESIGNS SEAT ON VILLAGE OF GLENCOE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

(Glencoe, Illinois) — Village of Glencoe Trustee Trent Cornell has notified Village President Lawrence R. Levin that he will resign his position on the Village Board of Trustees on August 31, 2018. Village Code requires that all Village Trustees reside in the corporate boundaries of the Village of Glencoe, and Trustee Cornell and his family are relocating outside of the community.

Trustee Cornell was elected to the Village Board of Trustees in April 2015 and in that time served on the Community Grants Committee and was integral to the development of the most recent Strategic Plan. Trustee Cornell is a partner at the law firm of Troutman Sanders and has lived in Glencoe with his wife Kim and family since 2006. Prior to serving on the Village Board of Trustees, Trustee Cornell served on the Village Zoning Board and as a Commissioner and President of the Glencoe Park District Board of Commissioners. Ms. Cornell is a corporate attorney with Medela, LLC, and among other things, serves as Secretary on the North Shore Exchange Board of Directors and was a Board member and former President of Family Services of Glencoe.

“While we are sad to see Trent and his family leave Glencoe, we sincerely thank him and Kim for their tremendous service to the community and wish them only the best,” noted Village President Levin. Trustee Cornell said that “it has been a privilege to be a part of the Glencoe community and to give back to the Village, which I encourage others to do as well.” He added that “while we are moving out of Glencoe, we have many close friends here and will not be strangers.”

Per State statute, an appointment to a vacancy on the Village Board may be made by the Village President and confirmed by the Village Board of Trustees. Should an appointment be made, the replacement trustee will serve through the end of Trustee Cornell’s current term, ending in April 2019. The replacement trustee would then be eligible to run for another term in the April 2019 election should he or she choose to do so. President Levin has begun the process of considering individuals who may be interested in serving as a Village Trustee and interested candidates should contact him via e-mail at larrylevin@villageofglencoe.org.
